The Olney Theatre Center for the Arts outside of Washington, D.C. where he assistant directed a series of Pinter Briefs and acted opposite Helen Hedman in Piaf, who was nominated for a Helen Hayes award for the title role. He performed in A Streetcar Named Desire directed by Andre Previn at The Kennedy Center and, after a brief stint directing regional commercials in New York City and appearing in the HBO Promotional Series The Undertaker's Dozen, he moved to Los Angeles where he studied Meisner technique for three years under Robert Carnegie, Tracy Aziz and Mark Pellegrino. He has acted in many films and done some minor television roles since moving to Los Angeles, however for the past year he has focused solely on the creation of this production. David's directing credits include Variations on the Death of Trotsky and Words, Words, Words by David Ives, Slop-Culture by Robb Badlam, The State of the Art by Nick Olsen and a pro-feminist, anti-war, all-female adaptation of Shakespeare's Henry V (extended run in Hollywood). David is thrilled to be a part of Lovely Bouquet of Flowers and would like to thank Jazzmun and the transgender community for their openness and support throughout this process.


∽DIRECTORS NOTES ≈

The purpose of Lovely Bouquet of Flowers is to empower all non-traditional voices of gender in regards to sexual preference, race and socioeconomic status, transforming lives through the use of monologue, dialogue and performance art.

Our play is based on real interviews that we conducted, which we then fictionalized for the purpose of stage presentation, and addresses issues involving homelessness, sex work, social work, religion, healthcare, ageism, and pride. Also, our use of flowers to represent characters achieves a unique interchangeability: with the success of the play, different communities across the globe will be able to add their own particular 'flowers' to the piece as their needs evolve.

Our dream is to have Lovely Bouquet of Flowers educate the general public and serve as a beacon of hope to anyone who has experienced injustice as a result of their gender orientation.

Tonight, we welcome you to the world premiere of our play with open arms to explore, laugh, cry and even, perhaps, to question previous gender assumptions you may have held. This moment has been a year in the making and we are positively thrilled that you have chosen to join us this evening as we continue on our journey. Enjoy!
